ORDER NO. 08-13-00-21-146

FOREST ORDER

Forest System Roads

Pursuant to Title 16 U.S.C. § 551 and Title 36 C.F.R. § 261.50, the following acts are prohibited on the National Forests and Grasslands in Texas. The National Forests & Grasslands in Texas is comprised of the Sam Houston, Davy Crockett, Sabine, Angelina National Forest and Caddo, Lyndon B. Johnson Grasslands. This Forest Order is effective from the date signed by the Forest Supervisor until December 31, 2024, or until terminated by an authorized Forest Service official, whichever occurs first.

Prohibitions. The following acts are prohibited:

- a. Using a road for commercial hauling without a permit, if the road is signed as requiring a commercial haul permit. [Ref. § 261.54(c)]
- b. Operating any motor vehicle on a National Forest System Road in violation of Texas Transportation Code. [Ref. § 261.54(d)]
- c. Operating or possessing a motorized vehicle on a National Forest System Road that is closed to traffic by means of a gate, sign or otherwise blocked by mound of dirt or other physical means. [Ref. § 261.54(e)]

Exemptions. Pursuant to 36 C.F.R § 261.50, the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of their official duty.
- 3. Persons with a Forest Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order, Form FS-7700-48, specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
- 4. Persons engaged in any of the following activities which have been authorized in writing by a permit, contract, or agreement:
- (1) grazing and livestock use, 36 C.F.R. Part 222 (§§ 222.1 222.76);
- (2) timber and special forest products use, 36 C.F.R. Part 223 (§§ 223.1 223.305); or
- (3) mineral use, 36 C.F.R. Part 228 (36 C.F.R. §§ 228.1 228.116).
 - a. Owners or lessees of land, to the extent necessary to access their land.

- b. Residents, to the extent necessary to access their residences.
- c. Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation are not exempt from the prohibitions listed above but may use National Forest System roads to the extent necessary to carry out their business, trade, or occupation.
