



HOLDEN MINE REMEDICATION FIVE-YEAR REVIEW

Healthy Landscapes Matter.

The USDA Forest Service is conducting its first five-year review (FYR) of the implemented remedial activities at the Holden Mine Remediation site, located within the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest in Chelan County, Washington. This review seeks to confirm that the cleanup activities conducted at the site continue to prevent further contamination of Railroad Creek and the surrounding environment. Activities include, but are not limited to treatment of groundwater, consolidation and capping of tailings, and long-term monitoring. A summary of the remedial activities and an evaluation of the protectiveness of the implemented tasks will be included in the FYR report.

What is a FYR?

A FYR is a required periodic review when contaminants remain at a site, and include: inspection of the site and cleanup technologies, monitoring data, maintenance records and more.

Timeline?

The Review covers the time period from 2018 through 2022.

The FYR Report will be available to the public summer 2023. It will be available online and in-person at the Chelan and Wenatchee USDA Forest Service offices.
