

About the Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest

The Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest is an urban forest, extending over 140 miles along the western slopes of the Cascade Mountains from the Canadian border to Mount Rainier National Park. The forest covers portions of Whatcom, Skagit, Snohomish, King and Pierce counties in Washington State. Nearly five million people live in Puget Sound area, and with another two million people living in neighboring Vancouver, BC, the Mt. Baker-Snoqualmie National Forest is one of the most visited in the country. The headquarters is in Everett, about an hour north of Seattle. District offices are located in Sedro-Woolley, Darrington, Skykomish and North Bend.
