

Enoree Seasonal Camps



The Enoree Ranger District offers three seasonal campgrounds: Collins Creek, Sedalia and Rocky Branch. These campgrounds have designated campsites in open areas surrounded by woods. The surrounding forest environment provides an opportunity for many recreational activities such as wildlife and plant observation, fishing, hiking and photography. Abundant wildlife populations provide some of the most desirable hunting areas in the upstate. Facility information and directions to the campgrounds are listed on the back.

Please Note

The Scan and Pay system on the recreation.gov mobile app is needed to pay for the campsite. There are QR codes posted on the information kiosk at each campground; users will select a campsite and scan the correct QR code for the payment option they plan to stay (nightly, monthly, or seasonal). Campers will then take a fee envelope, tear off the stub, and write their confirmation number and their name on the stub and clip it to the campsite post. It is the camper's responsibility to ensure the stub is protected. The Scan and Pay system will be the only way to pay for these campsites beginning September 2022.

Campsites at Sedalia are available for reservation on recreation.gov outside of the fall deer season and April turkey season. Collins Creek is reservable as a group campsite on recreation.gov outside of the fall deer season and April turkey season.

Information for all Enoree seasonal campgrounds

Fees: \$5 per night; extended stay fees of \$50 per calendar month and \$150 per season available during the fall deer season and April turkey season. America the Beautiful pass applicable to single night stays only.

Regulations

- Vehicle and occupancy limits apply at campsites. Please refer to Supervisor's Order # FMS 08-12-1-09-02 on web site.
- Campers must select a site and are responsible for paying at the info board within 30 minutes of arrival.
- Users must use the Scan and Pay system on the recreation.gov mobile app to pay for their site.
- Checkout time is 3 p.m. All camping equipment must be removed from the campground on the closing date shown on the permit, or the permit holder will be fined and charged for abandoned property.
- Refuse only in trash cans.
- Quiet time is 10 p.m.– 6 a.m.

Safety: Wear blaze orange during hunting season. The Forest Service is not responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.

Season: SCDNR sets all dates for open seasons for hunting. Information for when the campgrounds are open for extended stay during the fall deer season and April turkey season can be found at <https://www.fs.usda.gov/main/scnfs/home>.

Collins Creek Seasonal Camp

Campsites: Large grassy areas, 36 campsites.

Facilities: Water faucets located around campground, vault toilet, rock fire rings, and hot outdoor shower.

Directions: From Interstate 26: Take exit 72 and drive north 5.3 miles. Turn right onto Old Whitmire Hwy. (County Rd. 81) drive 0.4 miles to stop sign. Continue north on County Rd. 81, Brazzellmans Bridge Rd., and drive north 6.9 miles. Turn left onto Maybinton Rd., County Rd. 45, and drive north 2.3 miles. Turn left onto FS Road 393 and drive 0.3 miles to campground entrance on left.

From Whitmire Junction Hwy. 176 & Hwy. 72: Drive east for 2.5 miles. Turn right onto Maybinton Rd., County Rd. 45, and drive 4.4 miles. Turn right onto FS Road 393 and drive 0.3 miles to campground entrance on left.

Rocky Branch Seasonal Camp

Campsites: Large grassy areas, 10 campsites.

Facilities: Hand pump (Boil water 5 minutes before drinking), rock fire rings, and vault toilet.

Directions: From Interstate 26: Take exit 72 and drive north 5.3 miles. Turn right onto Old Whitmire Hwy. (County Rd. 81) drive 0.4 miles to stop sign. Turn right onto Hwy. 176 drive 4.8 miles to Hwy. 34. Turn left onto Hwy. 34 and drive east 10.9 miles to FS Rd. 412, Cooper Holmes Rd. Turn left on FS Rd. 412, Cooper Holmes Rd., and drive 1.6 miles to campground entrance on the left.

From Hwy. 72 and Hwy. 215 intersection in Carlisle: Drive south 12.4 miles on Hwy. 215. Turn right on FS Rd. 412, Cooper Holmes Rd., drive 2.4 miles to camp entrance on right.

Sedalia Seasonal Campsites

Campsites: Large grassy areas, 12 campsites.

Facilities: Drinking water, rock fire rings, and vault toilet at campground.

Directions: Sedalia Campground, Union County- From Junction Highway 49 & Hwy. 176: At intersection of Highway 49 and 176, drive west on Hwy. 49, 8 miles. Turn left, south onto 44-481, Bombing Range Road, and drive 1.9 miles. Sedalia Campground entrance is on the left side of the road.
