

ORDER
WILDERNESS OCCUPANCY AND USE REGULATIONS
PIKE AND SAN ISABEL NATIONAL FORESTS

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forests lands within the MOUNT MASSIVE WILDERNESS area until further notice.


- (1) Having more than 15 persons in any one group. 36 CFR 261.58(f).
- (2) Having more than a combination of 25 people and pack or saddle animals in any one stock group. 36 CFR 261.58(f).
- (3) Possessing dogs, except for working stock dogs, or dogs used for legal hunting purposes, unless under physical restraint of a leash. 36 CFR 261.58(s).
- (4) Camping within one hundred (100) feet of lakes, streams and forest development trails. 36 CFR 261.58(e).
- (5) Building, maintaining, attending, or using a campfire, within 100 feet of lakes, streams and forest development trails. 36 CFR 261.52(a).
- (6) Hitching, hobbling or tethering any pack or saddle animal within one hundred (100) feet of lakes, streams and forest development trails. 36 CFR 261.58(aa).
- (7) Short-cutting a switchback on a forest development trail. 36 CFR 261.55(d).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following are exempt from this order:

- (1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
- (2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in performance of an official duty.

This order supersedes order 86-02, dated May 27, 1986, signed by Jack Weissling, Forest Supervisor, and remains in effect until rescinded.

Violations of these prohibitions is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5000, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. Title 16 USC, Section 551.
