Wayne National Forest ORDER OF FOREST SUPERVISOR ORDER NUMBER WNF-14-01-2017

Under the authority of the Act of Congress dated June 4, 1897, as amended (16 U.S.C. 551), and pursuant to the Secretary of Agriculture's Regulations set forth as 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart B (36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b)), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the Wayne National Forest, Ironton Ranger District located within Lawrence and Scioto Counties and the State of Ohio. Said areas being described and designated as shown on the map set forth as Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereto:

• Entering or using any portion of the Telegraph Trail that is posted closed within the Ironton Ranger District of the Wayne National Forest 36 CFR 261.55(a).

THIS RESTRICTION IS NECESSARY TO PREVENT UNLAWFUL ACCESS TO PRIVATE PROPERTY AND TO PROTECT NATIONAL FOREST PROPERTY/RESOURCES. THEY ARE IN ADDITION TO THE GENERAL PROHIBITIONS SET FORTHAN 36 CFR PART 261. THE PROHIBITION WILL BE IN EFFECT FROM THE DATE OF THIS ORDER UNTIL SPECIFICALLY WITHDRAWN BY TERMINATION ORDER OF THE FOREST SUPERVISOR.

Pursuant to the provisions of 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission (36 CFR 261.50(e)(1)); and,
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty (36 CFR 261.50(e)(4).d

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.
