Clark Fork River Area (south side of the river)



OVERVIEW

South Fork Pilgrim Creek Trail #1084 travels from the Pilgrim Creek valley bottom and ends at the head end of the South Fork of Pilgrim Creek drainage on FSR 2710. Both the lower and upper trailhead are accessible by open Forest System road.

LENGTH OF TRAIL

3.7 miles one way

ELEVATION

Beginning: 3004' Ending: 5187' Net gain: 2183'

DIFFICULTY

Moderate

FACILITIES

There are small parking areas at both the lower and upper trailheads. The parking areas are not large enough to accommodate large vehicles with trailers.

DIRECTIONS

From the town of Noxon travel south on Pilgrim Creek Road. Proceed approximately six miles and turn onto FSR 2713 and travel approximately two miles to the end of the road and the trailhead.

TRAIL CONDITIONS

South Fork Pilgrim Creek Trail #1084 is a Trail Class 3 trail. The trail tread and corridor will be very well defined and visible. The trail is scheduled to be cleared every three years. Please contact Cabinet Ranger Station for current trail conditions.

STREAM CROSSINGS

The trail crosses the South Fork Pilgrim Creek just up the trail from the lower trailhead. This crossing can be challenging and dangerous during peak flows.

RESTRICTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

Motorized vehicles: South Fork Pilgrim Creek Trail #1084 is open to motorcycles.

Properly possess and store all food, refuse, and other attractants pursuant to Kootenai National Forest Food Storage Order (CFR 261.58 (cc)).
