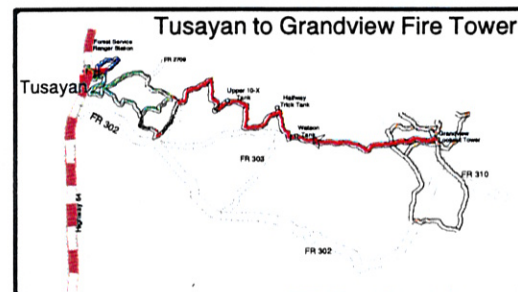

General Information: These routes offer secluded riding on old logging roads that meander through the forest. The forest is made up of Ponderosa Pine, Pinyon Pine, and Juniper. This area provides excellent opportunities for viewing a diverse community of wildlife species including: Elk, Mule Deer, Hawks, Eagles, Pronghorn Antelope, Porcupine, Rabbits, Coyotes, Turkeys, as well as a large variety of birds.

Route Description: The trail system is made up of several loops that will return you to the trailhead. There are three loops that are identified with a number located on a brown post. Loop #1 should be used to access loop #2, loop numbers 1 and 2 must be utilized to access loop #3.

Trail #4 to Grandview Lookout Tower is accessed from the northeast extent of loop #3. Trail 4 is a total of 16 miles from Tusayan to Grandview Tower, one way!
