ORDER NO. 02-13-04 CLEVELAND NATIONAL FOREST OCCUPANCY AND USE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a), and to provide for resource protection, the following act is prohibited within the Palomar Ranger District of the Cleveland National Forest. This Order is effective from April 5, 2013, through April 4, 2016.

Going into or being upon the Cedar Creek Falls Visitor Use Permit Area. The boundary of the Cedar Creek Falls Visitor Use Permit Area begins at the junction of Eagle Peak Road (Forest Road No. 13S06) and the San Diego River Gorge Trail, then continues eight-tenths of a mile to the northeast along the southern side of Eagle Peak Road and Trail, then continues due south for four-tenths of a mile, then continues due west for seven-tenths of a mile, then continues due north for two-tenths of a mile, then continues to the northeast along the southern side of Eagle Peak Road back to the starting point, as shown on Exhibit A. 36 CFR § 261.53(e).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571 and 3581.
