



Rock Creek Trail, No. 33060

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

General Description: This trail begins at the end of the Rock Creek Road (Beebe Springs) and extends westerly up Rock Creek to Marshall Meadow

Trail Use: Foot, horse, and bicycle

Length: 6.2 Miles

Trailhead Information: Accessed by a dirt road, no restroom available at the trailhead

Elevation in Feet: Min: 7,600 Max: 9,600 Change: 2,000

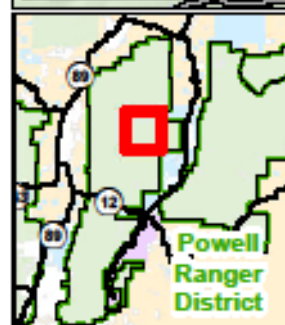
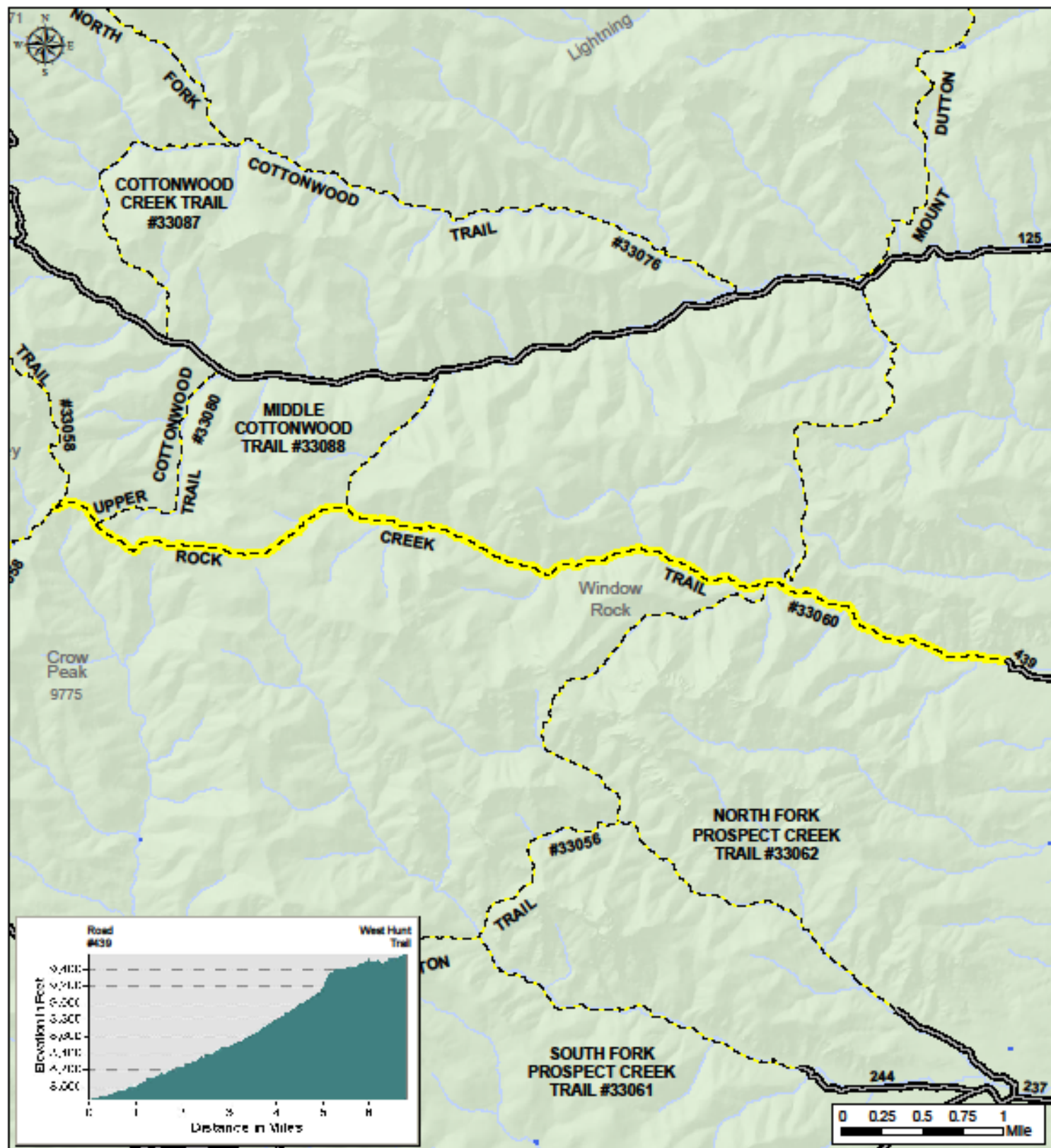
Water Availability: Water is available in the lower reaches of Rock Creek and at Marshall Meadow, but must be filtered or treated

Hazards /Obstacles: Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.

Topographic Maps: USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): Adams Head and Cow Creek

The Trailhead: From junction of 12 and Johns Valley Rd. (No. 22), Drive about 12 miles North on Johns Valley Road. Turn west or left on Mount Dutton Road (No. 125). Drive about 2 miles to Road No. 237 and turn left or south. Drive 237 for about 2 miles to road No. 439. Turn right on Road No. 439 going east to the trailhead, which is at the end of the road.

The Trail: The trail begins as a two track road turning to single track for the majority of the trail. This is a gradual climb with a few steep sections. The trail is rocky going through the bottom drainage and eventually follows the base of Adams Head, climbing to the ridge top. This trail will connect with West Hunt Trail and Upper Cottonwood trail.
