

## ORDER

### BOB MARSHALL, GREAT BEAR, AND SCAPEGOAT WILDERNESSES

#### Flathead, Helena, Lewis and Clark, and Lolo National Forest

To [protect the resources, quality and wilderness character of the area pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50, the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Bob Marshall, Great Bear, and Scapegoat Wildernesses, Region One, unless authorized by permit from the Supervisor or District Ranger who has jurisdiction over the Area. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations and become effective 12:01 a.m. June 10, 1982 and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

1. Use of the Area by parties or groups consisting of over 15 persons. (36 CFR 261.58f)
2. Possession by any individual, party, or group of the following camping or pack-outfitting equipment. (36 CFR 261.576)
  - a. Saddle pack, or draft animals exceeding 35 in number.
  - b. Livestock sale, except in block form and in a quantity sufficient for the stock on the trip.
3. Camping in an area or campsite or storing equipment, personal property, or supplies for more than 14 consecutive days within any 45-day period. For purposes of this restriction, an area or campsite is defined as any given location and the area surrounding for a distance of 5 miles. This does not prohibit outfitter base camps authorized under special use permit. (36 CFR 261.57f) (36 CFR 261.58a)
4. Disposing of any debris or garbage, including excess livestock sale. This does not prohibit the destruction of combustible material by burning or the disposal of human or livestock waste. (36 CFR 261.57g)
5. Shortcutting a switchback on any trail. (36 CFR 261.55d)
6. Possessing or using a saddle, pack, or draft animal on any trail unless it is being ridden or led in single file. (36 CFR 261.55c)
7. Possessing or using a bicycle, wagon, cart, or other vehicle. (36 CFR 261.57h)

Temporary exceptions are authorized to the above listed controls for any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty and any person whose use is expressly authorized by the Forest Service under a permit, license, or contract.
