Thank you for your interest in the National Forests and Grasslands of the Rocky Mountain Region. The information supplied here is general, but should help you determine the names and areas of national forests that you may wish to visit.

National forest visitor maps of the Rocky Mountain Region are available for \$6.00 each for paper and \$7.00 each for plastic (where applicable). Each map covers all or a portion of one national forest. The scale is 1/2 inch per mile, and the maps show roads, trails, streams, lakes, recreation sites, land ownership, and major points of interest.

We also offer statewide Wilderness maps for Colorado and Wyoming, showing all the Congressionally designated Wilderness Areas within each state.

We do not print maps outside of national forest boundaries. All orders must be pre-paid and will be delivered by first class mail. To order visitor maps, please mail your completed map order form to:

## Campgrounds

Forest Service campgrounds are usually open from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. After Labor Day many campgrounds remain open but water systems are turned off and visitors are asked to pack out their own trash. A typical campground will have individual parking spaces (most accommodate trailers averaging 18' in length), tables, firepits, and a central water supply. Most have vault toilets. The limit of stay varies from 1 to 14 days. Fees range from \$5 to \$15 a day and are paid at the campground. Most campsites are available on a first come, first served basis, but you can reserve a site at selected campgrounds through a reservation system. ## Campfires

Campfires for cooking and warming are generally permitted on national forests. Use only dead wood found on the ground. Fires may be restricted or prohibited in certain areas (signs will be posted in these areas.) Within camp and picnic grounds, campfires may be built only in the grates provided. Please be careful with fire.

## Firearms

Firearms may be carried in national forests and grasslands and fired where safe and in compliance with state and federal laws. Forest Service regulations prohibit the discharge of a firearm or any other weapon; 1) in or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or 2) across or on a forest road or body of water.

## Fireworks

Possessing, discharging or igniting a firecracker, rocket or other firework or explosive is strictly prohibited in national forests and grasslands.

## Fishing and Hunting

Fishing and hunting in compliance with state laws is allowed on national forests and grasslands. A valid state license is required.

## Roads

Most roads identified as "all weather" on the visitor maps are suitable for passenger cars and vehicles pulling trailers. Roads identified as "dirt" may not be suitable for sedans or vehicles pulling trailers. Primitive and 4-wheel drive roads may be passable only with 4-wheel drive vehicles.

## Pets

Dogs are allowed on National Forest System lands, but must be under master's control at all times. Contact local Forest Service offices for more information.

## Water

Water from developed systems at recreation sites is safe to drink. Open water sources are easily contaminated by human or animal waste. Water from springs, lakes, ponds, and streams should be treated. A recommended treatment is boiling water for fifteen minutes.

National forests were created from public lands to be managed for the long term benefits of the American people. They are yours to use, enjoy and help protect.

As a user of national forest lands, you have significant responsibilities for your personal safety during any activity you pursue.
