FIRE AND TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS**

**NEBRASKA NATIONAL FOREST (Nebraska)
OGLALA NATIONAL GRASSLAND (Nebraska)
SAMUEL R. McKELVIE NATIONAL FOREST (Nebraska)
BUFFALO GAP NATIONAL GRASSLAND (South Dakota)
FT. PIERRE NATIONAL GRASSLAND (South Dakota)**

Fire and travel restrictions pursuant to 36 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 261.50(a)(b) implemented by the Nebraska National Forest Supervisor on August 3, 2000, are hereby rescinded. This order applies only to Order Number: NNF-01-00 and does not rescind any other orders that may apply to fire or travel restrictions on the above listed national forest system lands.

This order becomes effective October 5, 2000 at noon.

ORDER NUMBER: NNF-01-00

FIRE AND TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS

NEBRASKA NATIONAL FOREST (Nebraska),
OGLALA NATIONAL GRASSLAND (Nebraska),
SAMUEL R. McKELVIE NATIONAL FOREST (Nebraska),
BUFFALO GAP NATIONAL GRASSLAND (South Dakota), and the
FT. PIERRE NATIONAL GRASSLAND (South Dakota).

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a), and (b) the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Nebraska National Forest, including the Samuel R McKelvie National Forest, Oglala National Grassland, Buffalo Gap National Grassland, and Ft. Pierre National Grassland, until further notice.

Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, charcoal broiler, or a coal or wood stove without a permit except in a Forest Service designated developed campground, picnic ground, or in an area posted authorizing fires within that area by a Forest Officer. 36 CFR 261.52(a)

Permits are not required for use of petroleum-fueled stoves, lanterns, or heating devices, provided such devices meet the fire underwriters specifications for safety.

2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a Forest Service developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. 36 CFR 261.52(d)
3. Welding, or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame, except within an area that is barren or cleared of all flammable material at least 10 feet on all sides from the equipment. 36 CFR 261.52(i)
4. Possessing or using motorized vehicle off Forest Development Roads. 36 CFR 261.56

Operating an internal combustion engine, except on a forest development road or forest development trail. 36 CFR 261.52(h).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

Persons with a permit that was issued after the date of this order specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.

- 2 Any Federal, State, or Local Officer or member of an organized firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

For the purposes of this order the following definition applies

Forest Development Road means a road wholly or partly within or adjacent to and serving a part of the National Forest System and which has been included in the Forest Development Road System Plan (On the Forest Map).

This order becomes effective August 04, 2000, at noon, and will remain in force until rescinded.

Violations of this prohibition are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both, [16 U.S.C. 551, 18 U.S.C. 3571(b)(6)].
