

SEASON OF USE

All year

ELEVATION

1914 feet

FACILITIES

79 camp units, toilets, water hydrants, public pay phone, 6 picnic units adjacent to the paved boat launch ramp, courtesy dock, fish cleaning station; NO hook-ups.

BARRIER-FREE ACCESSIBILITY

The area offers access to visitors using wheelchairs with mobility. Camp units and trails have compacted gravel surfaces. Toilets and picnic tables are fully accessible.

FEES

Day-use and camping fees apply
Single or tent site maximum: (\$10.00 per night) 10 people, 2 vehicles and 1 watercraft.
Double site maximum: (\$15.00 per night) 20 people, 4 vehicles, and 2 watercraft

NEAREST COMMERCIAL SERVICES

Apache Lake Marina: Compressed air, food, gas, lodging, marina services, pay phone and propane.
Globe, Payson and Apache Junction: All services

ATTRACTIONS

- Access is by the Apache Trail National Forest Scenic Byway, a scenic mountain road showcasing magnificent bluffs above Apache Lake.
- Nearby are wonderful views of majestic mountains with abundant wildlife.

LOCATION AND ACCESS

This site is 6 miles south of Roosevelt Dam on the south shoreline of Apache Lake.

From Apache Junction: Drive north on State Hwy. 88 for 38 miles (the last 20 miles of State Hwy. 88 are unpaved) to Forest Road (FR) 183/Burnt Corral Recreation Site. Turn left and continue to site.

From Mesa: Take State Hwy. 87/Beeline Highway north for approximately 60 miles to its junction with State Hwy. 188. Turn right onto State Hwy. 188 for 33 miles to its junction with State Hwy. 88. Turn right onto State Hwy. 88, and drive past historic Roosevelt Dam (unpaved) for 6 miles to Forest Road (FR) 183/Burnt Corral Recreation Site. Turn right and continue to the site.

From the Globe area: Take State Hwy. 188 west for 30 miles to its junction with State Hwy. 188. Turn left onto State Hwy. 88, and continue past historic Roosevelt Dam (unpaved) for 6 miles to Forest Road (FR) 183/Burnt Corral Recreation Site. Turn right into the site.

CONSIDERATIONS

- State Hwy. 88 is a narrow winding mountain road, with a maximum vehicle length limit of 40 feet.
- **Sewage dump facilities:** From the State Hwy. 88/188 junction, take State Hwy. 188 north for 5 miles to milepost 249. **South State Hwy. 88:** From Burnt Corral go south on State Hwy. 88 for 23 miles to milepost 213 at Tortilla Flat. (fee charged)
- Rules and regulations are posted at all fee station areas. Please read and observe.
- Please use trash receptacles when available, or **PACK IT IN, PACK IT OUT!!**
- Not recommended for trailers **over 22 feet.**
- Boat sewage pump-out at the Apache Lake Marina.
- Camp hosts are usually available for information.
