### TERMINI INFORMATION

**South end:** Forest Road (FR) 651C

**North end:** Pipeline Trail 193

### TRAIL INFORMATION

**Trail use:** Light to moderate

**Trail difficulty:** Easiest

**Trail length:** 0.6 miles

**Season of Use:** Spring - fall

**USGS maps:** Pinal Peak

**Elevation:** 7640 feet to 7760 feet

### ATTRACTIONS

- The Pinal Mountains are noted for their scenic beauty and ruggedness.
- From east to west the trail shows a continuum of areas disturbed by man and reclaimed by Mother Nature to areas of near pristine forest.

### TRAIL NARRATIVE

This trail connects the Sixshooter National Recreation Trail 197 and the Pipeline Trail 193. It provides a connection between the trails on the north side of Pinal and those on the south. From a small parking spur on Forest Road (FR) 651C (.3 mile east of the turnoff to Ferndell Trailhead) the trail goes west following the driveway of a burned-out recreation residence until just beyond the intersection with the Sixshooter National Recreation Trail 197. It continues generally west becoming a constructed footpath. Near its midpoint it crosses the FR 651 at the ruins of the Girl Scout Camp, then continues west and connects with the Pipeline Trail.

### CONSIDERATIONS

- Do not drink untreated water. Giardia, a protozoan, is in many water impoundments and streams.
- If you PACK IT IN, PACK IT OUT!!**
- Carry an adequate supply of drinking water. One gallon/per person/per day is recommended during hot periods.
