### **Wild Horse Raffle Net's Over \$1,000 for Local Scholarship Fund**

**Klamath Falls, OR** – Local 4-H Equestrian clubs of Klamath County, raised \$1,045 towards a Scholarship fund at this year's Klamath County Fair. Teamed with the Klamath Falls Resource Area of Lakeview District's Bureau of Land Management (BLM), 4-H members raffled a wild horse that was donated from the Burns Wild Horse Corrals.

For over a decade now, the BLM has offered a wild horse during the county fair through the Wild Horse and Burro Program. More recently, the BLM teamed up with local 4-H equestrian clubs, supplying a horse for the 4-H clubs to raffle. The clubs provide chances to win the horse, at \$5 per entry, making available scholarship dollars for lucky 4-H members. Over the last five years, eight 4-H equestrian members received scholarships, benefiting from the \$6,935 raised through this program.

The 4-H Club scholarship winners for 2003 are Carrie Bose, Sherri Nelson and Jaris Smith. The lucky winner of the wild horse is Paula Rogers from Dallas, Oregon.

BLM's Lakeview Resource Area also worked with a local scholarship committee to provide a wild horse for this year's Lake County Fair and Roundup. Nearly \$400 was raised, and the scholarship recipient is Cindy Anderson. The winner of the wild horse is Barbara Machado of Lakeview, Oregon.
