## Summer Camp For Teens

**Klamath Falls, Oregon** – Now is the time for high school students to sign-up for the 13<sup>th</sup> anniversary session of Resources and People (RAP) Camp planned for June 13-19, 2004, at Camp Esther Applegate, which is located at Lake of the Woods high in the Oregon Cascades, near Klamath Falls, Oregon. The deadline to sign-up is April 20<sup>th</sup>. Cost for participants is a \$75 registration fee, which includes meals and camp lodging. Transportation is available from central locations.

Attendees at the week-long session will include high school students as well as high school and elementary educators from throughout Oregon, Southern Washington and Northern California. RAP Camp targets both urban and rural communities and seeks to have culturally diverse participation. Students are given many career ideas and can receive high school credit. Teachers earn 3 hours of continuing education credit from Southern Oregon University.

Sponsored initially by the Fremont, Modoc and Winema National Forests along with the Lakeview District of the Bureau of Land Management, the program has been expanded to include participation by other local, state and federal agencies as well as community volunteers, organizations and businesses. The overall objective is to introduce participants to natural resources and share current ecosystem management practices.
