Identifying Wildflowers

Primary Color



White & Green Yellow & Orange Pink, Red & Brown Blue & Violet

Shape



Asymmetrical or irregular Two—Three petals Four—Six petals



Seven or more petals Multiple thin petals Fused, bell or trumpet petals

Arrangement



Individual flowers (no clusters) Elongated clusters Rounded or flat clusters
