This cabin features a living room with futon couch/bed, and two bedrooms (one with double bed and one with bunk beds). It has a small kitchen with table and stove, and a bathroom with flush toilet. It sleeps six persons. No potable water is available in the cabin. During camping season, potable water is available from a hand pump well at a campground two miles west. Propane heater, hot water heater, cook range, refrigerator and lights are available. Propane is furnished. The cabin provides easy access to The Brothers and Mt. Skokomish Wilderness Areas, the Hood Canal, and the Olympic National Park.

Historic 24' X 20' log cabin with kitchen, living room with futon couch/bed, and bedroom with twin bunk beds. Sleeps 4 persons. No electricity. Propane heater, cook range, refrigerator and lights. Propane is furnished. No water available on site. During camping season, potable water is available from a hand pump well at a nearby campground. An vault toilet is located on the property. A trailhead accessing two separate trails is located on-site. The cabin provides convenient access to the Hood Canal, The Brothers Wilderness Area, and the Olympic National Park.

### Brief Description of Project Area

Living room with futon couch/bed, two bedrooms, one with double bed and one with twin bunk beds and will sleep six. The cabin is also furnished with a kitchen, table and chairs, cook stove, refrigerator, dishes, pots, silverware and cooking utensils. Electricity and propane (for heat and cooking) are provided. There is no potable water, shower, flush toilets, or other running water within the cabin. There is an outdoor "port-a-potty", which is serviced weekly. The cabin provides convenient access to the Buckhorn Wilderness Area, several wilderness and non-wilderness trails, and the Dungeness and Gray Wolf rivers.
