The Forestry Training Center will be the first and only training and equipment center in the United States. It is modeled after successful institutions in Sweden and adapted to the Pacific Northwest. The Center will train operators in advanced harvesting technology and operational environmentally sensitive silvicultural procedures. Continued operations of the Center will be supported by earned income. The FS will pay for start-up costs associated with the hiring of an executive director. The community identified the need for this type of facility in the Forks Action Planning process and the county-wide prioritization process. This project ranks #3 of 11 county-wide and supports the #1 priority, the Forks Industrial Park. The Center has national significance in that it will provide skilled logging employees for the 21st century. The Center will also pay a part in maintaining a sustainable log supply for Northwest mills by training loggers in new forestry concepts.
