Brief Description of Project Area

Wildwood is located about 40 miles east of Portland near Welches, Oregon on Highway 26. The Wildwood Recreation Site is a 560 acre developed day-use recreation facility and site located on the banks of the Salmon Wild and Scenic River in the forested foothills of the Cascade Mountains near Mt. Hood. The site encompasses undeveloped/developed areas which includes group shelters and individual picnic units, ballfields, open play areas, a playground, horseshoe pits, volleyball/basketball courts, and an extensive assortment of trails and accessible interpretive facilities. Use fees are charged for rental of group shelters/picnic units and associated facilities. Wildwood Recreation Site is open to vehicles annually from mid-March through November. During the winter season, the site is open to pedestrians and bicyclists only but schools and education groups may make advance
