The shellfish and fishing industry are dependent on dredged harbors to off-load their products. Full implementation of this project will save many jobs associated with the fishing industry. There are also several recreational boat launches in the Willapa Bay that are in need of dredging. The existing jurisdictions lack adequate funding. Without the required funding and maintenance, recreational opportunities will decline.
