This project will enable the City to come into compliance with the Washington Safe Drinking Water Act and prepare the City for economic growth. The City will have an assessment of the existing condition and an assessment of future needs necessary to support any additional economic growth.

This grant of \$39,254 will help the County to renovate the existing emergency room at Garfield County Memorial Hospital. The project includes: enlarging the emergency room to accommodate a second gurney; moving medical gas tanks to a new location and piping the gas in through the emergency room wall; and renovating existing space for a family room/doctor dictation room, registration area, and patient bathroom. The emergency room renovation would provide the hospital with increased space required to triage multiple accident victims efficiently and manage resources more effectively. The project will also strengthen the County's ability to attract new businesses and residents by offering better medical services.
