



# Forest Accomplishments

## Wallowa-Whitman National Forest

Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region

*Our Volunteers are putting their user fees to work.*



With a unique and diverse NE Oregon landscape, the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest offers over 1700 miles of hiking trails, 60 campgrounds, and 50 day use areas.

Each year over 565,000 visitors come to the Wallowa-Whitman Forest to hike a national historic or recreation trail, explore thousands of acres in the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area, and photograph dozens of high alpine lakes in the Eagle Cap Wilderness.

The users fees collected at 34 campgrounds, 26 trailheads/picnic areas, and 7 recreational lodgings help keep these sites operational for the visitors each year. To put these fees 'back the work', the Forest ensures that fees go back to the Ranger Districts they were collected on and address needs and desires that visitors want. Through partnerships with our volunteers like the Blue Mtn Backcountry Riders, Campground HOSTs and the American Hiking Society, users are making a difference in customer service, facility improvements, and resource protection.

***Your Fees At Work:***  
*Maintaining trails in the Eagle Cap Wilderness and Hells Canyon NRA*

# The Accomplishments:

## Northwest Forest Pass:

- Repaired 15 major washouts in the Hells Canyon and Eagle Cap Wilderness areas.
- Supported over 3000 hours of volunteer work for routine trail maintenance.
- Maintained 230 miles of trails with volunteers and Forest Service crews.
- Cleaned 28 toilets at trailheads for 14-16 weeks (minimum once per week).
- Repaired stock corrals at Deadman Trailhead.
- Completed general operations and maintenance of 24 trailheads and 2 picnic areas (ie. cleaning toilets, fire-rings and tables; testing water, etc).



## Campgrounds:

- Utilized Campground Hosts for average 16 weeks at 11 Campgrounds (over 3700 hours of volunteer service).
- Expanded the water system at Tamarack Campground, and improved Pittsburg Landing Campground water system.
- Cleaned 58 toilets throughout summer and completed the annual maintenance and operations at 34 campgrounds (ie. Tested water, cleaned tables, and fire-rings, provide information and site security.)
- Painted 6 toilets in the Lostine Corridor and 3 at Pittsburg Landing.
- Treated 4 acres of noxious weeds.
- Installed 2 campground gates.



## Cabin Rentals:

- Replaced porch logs at the Anthony Lakes Guard Station
- General operations and maintenance of 7 rentals (ie. Cleaning, minor repairs to buildings and interior, purchasing new furniture and utensils)
- Conducted annual seasonal safety tests such as water testing, propane-system integrity tests at 7 rentals.
