Description:

The Suquamish Tribe will conduct a feasibility study to evaluate the opportunity for a fish processing plant to be located on the Port Madison Indian Reservation. The feasibility study will look at value-added seafood products with a business incubator to train entrepreneurs in marketing, product development, control techniques, financial projections, and business operations of the seafood product. This project is a further step to maximize the Suquamish Tribe's seafood resources and further progress toward economic self-sufficiency. This project is a cooperative effort with the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe and will address some of the training and job issues that both tribes now have. Jobs for tribal members will be created, members will be trained in business practices.

Description:

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe will construct a 6000 square foot Longhouse Cultural Center, a timber frame building with carved cedar posts. The Cultural Center will include a large gathering/display area that will seat 500 people, a kitchen and storage area will be included. Grant funds will be used to purchase cedar logs for carving, documentation, construction, and administration of the longhouse project. The longhouse is the traditional center of Tribal activities. By the end of the third year, the Longhouse Cultural Center will provide catering services, conventions, and curated shows of the art work of Tribal members. By the end of the fourth year, it is expected that 4,000 participants will have attended cultural events in the first S'Klallam longhouse in almost a century.

Description:

Funding is to (1) prepare a risk assessment, including analysis of fuels, access roads, and residential density within the urban-wildland interface; (2) build a fire risk analysis model and plan; (3) recommend changes based on the risk assessment for the interface areas; and (4) develop and implement both a homeowner education and signage program. We hope this project reduces fire risk and improves survivability of people and property located in the urban-wildland interface zone.
