## The Accomplishments:



### Recreation Lodging:

- Added a water treatments system at Two Color Guard Station rental
- Re-painted the kitchen at Antlers Guard Station
- Completed the Water and Propane tests at 7 cabin rentals
- Reduced fuel loads around 2 cabin rentals (Two Color and Moss Springs).
- Pumped 2 toilets at the Two Color and Moss Springs rentals
- Tested water systems on monthly basis at 6 rentals.
- 



### Campgrounds: (Camping includes – R6 Camping – Camping Safety Net – NRRS).

- Staffed 11 campgrounds with Campground HOSTS for 3-4 months benefiting from over 5900 hours of volunteer time.
- Refurbished tables and reset fire-rings at Vigne and Hurricane Campgrounds.
- Reduced safety hazards (ie. Hazard trees removal) at 16 Campgrounds
- Repaired the water systems at Tamarack and Indian Crossing Campgrounds.
- Repainted 3 restrooms and 2 sunscreen shelters at Pittsburg Landing Campground
- Cleaned and pumped toilets at 19 campgrounds.
- Trimmed weeds and grass around camp sites at Pittsburg Campground.
- Tested water systems on monthly basis at 11 campgrounds.



### Northwest Forest Pass:
