

ORDER #90-20
SPECIAL CLOSURE
SAN JUAN NATIONAL FOREST
REGION 2

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a):

During the period June 26, 1990, until further notice it is prohibited to use any motorized vehicles (4-wheel drive vehicles, all-terrain vehicles, motorcycles, snowmobiles, etc.) on the following portions of the old and new East Creek Trail (36 CFR 261.55(b)). This restriction is in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations.

As displayed on the attached map, the old and new portions of the East Creek Trail (#535.1 and #535) from 100 feet northeast of lower Lion Creek (NW1/4, NW1/4, Section 11, T.36N., R.6W.) and at the southwestern divide between Lion Creek and Bear Trap Canyon (NW1/4, NE1/4, Section 12, T.36N., R.6W.) to the upper end of Trail #535 at the fence (NW1/4, NE1/4, Section 27, T.37N., R.5W.).

This closure is implementation of the East Creek Decision, signed October 12, 1983 by Forest Supervisor Paul Sweetland.

The following are exempt from the provision of this order (36 CFR 261.50(e)):

- (a) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This order is effective on June 26, 1990.


