Residential Burn Permits

Burning permits are required year round for all residential debris burning. The permits can be issued at most Forest Service Visitor Centers and fire stations, Bureau of Land Management fire stations or CAL FIRE fire stations. If you are within a Fire District contact your local fire chief.

The following are burning permit requirements:

- Permittees are required to call (760) 872-2555 prior to ignition
- Burn piles will consist of vegetation materials only
- Maximum 4 feet X 4 feet piles in diameter
- Burning hours are confined to 6:00 AM to 12 noon
- Burning on windy days, even if permissible, is not advised
- Have a water supply and a shovel on site
- A responsible adult needs to be in attendance of the burn pile at all time
- All burn permits are valid until 12/31 of the year issued and are subject to restrictions

Burn permits are only valid on "Permissive Burn Days" as determined by the State Air Resources Board or the local Air Pollution Control District (APCD). Violations of any burning permit terms are a Violation of State Law (Public Resources Code 4421, 4422, 4423 And 4425) punishable by fine and/or up to one year in the county jail.
