**MENDOCINO NATIONAL FOREST**  
**October 2013**

**The Purpose of this Document is to:**

- Provide early notice of current projects and activities proposed within the Forest;
- Provide an understanding of the types of activities that occur in the Forest;
- Provide an initial opportunity to participate in the public involvement process for the projects that are of interest to you;  
and
- Provide an early opportunity for the public and tribes to identify specific resources within proposed project areas, e.g., historic, cultural, or traditional properties that are important to consider in the planning process.

**What this Document Tells You:**

- What types of activities are proposed;
- The general location of the activities;
- The current status of the planning process for each proposal, and
- Whom to contact for more specific information.

**SOPA Supplement:**

The standard SOPA that is produced from the national planning database leaves out some proposals for categorically excluded actions for which policy does not require formal documentation in a Decision Memo. The Forest Supervisor has decided to include a supplemental listing of such proposals, in the interest of having a consistent source of public information regarding all proposed management actions on Mendocino National Forest.
