## Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Funded seasonal work crews who completed maintenance work at ten campgrounds.
- Leveraged funds with Idaho State Parks and Recreation grant money to complete a new water system for the Albert Moser and Emigration campgrounds.
- Replaced toilet at Gravel Creek Campground.
- Removed hazard trees in several campgrounds.
- Partially funded the purchase of a new restroom for Gravel Creek Campground.
- Provided law enforcement at district campgrounds.
- Resurfaced Summit View Campground, including roads and parking areas for single, double and group sites.
- Installed new interior walls and flooring at Johnson Guard Station.
- Renovated Diamond Creek Guard Station and made it available as a recreation rental: Replaced doors, windows, flooring and interior walls and constructed perimeter fencing.
- Repaired Egan Basin Guard Station with new flooring, windows and doors, and installed new front and back porches with a new wood burning stove.
- Added a new wood burning stove and new flooring and siding at Clear Creek Guard Station.
- Repaired water systems at Summit and Scout Mountain campgrounds.
- Funded seasonal crews to brush campground roads and parking spurs on district campgrounds.

## Caribou-Targhee Accomplishments Continued

- Repaired Mesa Falls boardwalk and information boards.
- Painted handrails at Mesa Falls and installed a bear-proof trash can.
- Sanded and re-stained the floor at the Squirrel Meadows rental cabin.
- Installed new interpretive panels at Squirrel Meadows, Warm River, and Bishop Mountain rental cabins.
- Purchased new campground furniture for Steel Creek Campground, including picnic tables and serving tables.
- Bought campground supplies for the district campgrounds and funded required water testing and solid waste removal.
- Funded a new entry sign for Stoddard Creek Campground; the old sign was stolen a year earlier.
