## Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Completed repairs at Indian Creek Boat Launch, including launch ramp design and transporting heavy lumber into the backcountry. Partners, volunteers and wilderness rangers completed the ramp in one week.
- Supported hosts and recreation guards who completed maintenance work at fee campgrounds.
- Removed hazard trees at Bonanza Group Campground.
- Inspected outfitter permits and recreation events to assure that their operations met performance standards and to make sure participants were having a safe adventure.

## Special Feature

The partnership for providing river flow information is going strong between U.S. Geological Survey and the forest. For over 20 years the two agencies have provided critical safety information about water flows on the Middle Fork River. Boater safety on this rapidly changing river is a high priority, and boaters are able to gauge difficulty of the rapids based on solid real-time data about water flow.

## Salmon-Challis Accomplishments Continued

- Inspected each boat on the Middle Fork River for invasive species.
- Checked for permits and safety measures for anglers and boaters who access the wild Main Salmon River at Corn Creek Boat Launch from April through November.
- Removed hazard trees along assigned river camps in the Middle Fork.
- Inventoried and surveyed alternative campsites along the Middle Fork River corridor to expand camping opportunities for smaller groups and to reduce impacts associated with continual use of popular campsites.


