PRESCRIBED FIRE PLANNED FOR BLUE MOUNTAIN RANGER DISTRICT

John Day, OR - The Blue Mountain Ranger District began their fall prescribed burning in Antelope Valley 2.5 miles South East of Seneca, and South of County Road 16 on October 16, announced Steve Cross, Blue Mountain Fire Management Officer. The prescribed fire will decrease the intensity of future wildfires and will improve wildlife forage, rangeland, and plant vigor to maintain a healthy ecosystem as well as return the area to its historical condition.

“Smoke will be visible from Highway 395 South and from Seneca and will impact visitors in the immediate area of the burn in addition to those downwind,” said Cross. “Visibility in the vicinity of the prescribed burn along county Road 16 may also be impaired, particularly during the morning and evening hours for several days after the ignition is complete so visitors in the area are asked to drive with caution”.

Ignition operations are expected to take 2 to 3 days once the project begins and it is anticipated that burning will continue through October.
