

Campbell Tree Grove Campground

ACCESS: Travel US Highway 101 to FS Road #22, approximately 15 miles south of the South Shore Quinault Lake Road. Turn east and drive to junction with FS Road #2204. Follow #2204 to junction with FS Road #2208. Stay left on Road #2204 and drive 10 miles to Campbell Tree Grove Campground.



NOTE: The normal access route would be via FS Road #22; however, the road bridge is out.

FACILITIES: The campground has potable water from well, barrier-free vault toilets. There are 11 campsites that accommodate tents and trailers up to 16 feet in length. This is a remote campground with limited facilities.

SETTING: Campbell Tree Grove Campground is located adjacent to the West Fork Humptulips River in the beautiful temperate rain forest. Towering conifers including Sitka spruce, Douglas-fir, western hemlock and western red cedar provide dense shade for this beautiful setting. The forest floor is covered with lush rain forest plants.

OPPORTUNITIES: Camping, picnicking, hiking and fishing are possible in the area. The Pete’s Creek Trail #858 provides access into the Colonel Bob Wilderness and to the summit of Colonel Bob, 4510 feet elevation with panoramic views of Quinault Lake. The Lower Pete’s Creek Trail #858.1 provides access to the West Fork Trail #806 and the West Fork Humptulips River.

FEE: None. There is no fee for camping at this campground.



Campbell Tree Grove Campground is located in a beautiful old-growth stand of conifers and hardwoods. Licorice ferns can be found growing on the trunks and branches of the bigleaf maples.

PASS REQUIRED: A Northwest Forest Pass, Golden Age/Access Pass, or Interagency Pass is required on all vehicles parked at trailheads. Day & Annual Passes are available at FS offices and vendors, but not available at trailheads.
