


**ACCESS:** Travel US Highway 101 to junction with South Shore Road, 40 miles north of Aberdeen or 66 miles south of Forks. Turn east and drive 2 miles to Lake Quinault Lodge Resort. Parking across from Lodge.

**OPPORTUNITIES:** The Lodge Trail provides an excellent year-round opportunity to view the Olympic Rain Forest. This trail provides access to the Quinault National Recreation Trail from the Lodge. Excellent opportunities for hiking with children, viewing rain forest scenery, bird watching and nature study.

**CLOSURES:** Motorized vehicles, mountain bikes, and stock are prohibited.


**TOPO MAP:** Quinault-Colonel Bob Custom Correct Map. Free trail map available at the Quinault Forest Service office.



**FACILITIES:** The trailhead is across the South Shore Quinault Road from the entrance to Lake Quinault Lodge. Parking only, no facilities.

**SETTING:** Dense old-growth conifer forest with lush understory of rain forest vegetation.

**TRAIL INFORMATION:** The Lodge Trail provides access primarily for guests staying at the Lake Quinault Lodge to hike the Quinault National Recreation Trail #854. The Lodge Trail begins across from the Lodge entrance and is only 0.6 mile in length. The Lodge Trail provides a short hike to see the rain forest and is a good short hike for children. The Quinault National Recreation Trail provides a 4-mile loop hike through the rain forest and along the south shore of Lake Quinault before returning to the Lodge.

**PASS NOT REQUIRED:** A Northwest Forest Pass or a Golden Passport (Eagle, Age or Access) is NOT REQUIRED for parking at trailhead.
