




# Mountainair RD Travel Management Gallinas Unit Decision Map

System roads are routes which meet the following criteria in the FS corporate database:  
 1. It is a Forest Service system road  
 2. Road is under Forest Service jurisdiction  
 3. Road exists  
 4. Road is open

This map includes all motorized use designations for the Proposed Action. All designations are available to all motor vehicles at any time of the year, unless specified closed under a separate Closure Order. Dispersed camping corridors allow driving to camp off-road. The corridor width is 150 feet on either side of the road on the Manzano Division and 300 feet on the Gallinas Division, unless the map indicates otherwise.
