OCCUPANCY AND USE / FIRE

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(a) the following acts are prohibited on the area described in this order and as shown in Exhibit A, within the Shoshone National Forest.

1.Camping. **36 CFR 261.58(e)**

Camping is allowed only in developed recreation sites designed for overnight camping.

2.Building, maintaining, attending, or using a campfire, charcoal fire, or stove fire. **CFR 261.52(a)**

Fires may be used only at developed recreation sites in a fire ring or grill provided for this purpose.

3.Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun. **36 CFR 261.58(m)**

**Prohibited between June 1st and September 1st annually.**

These prohibitions apply to the area that is commonly known as North Fork Canyon and includes the area within one-half mile on either side of the center line of U.S. highway 14-16-20 between the National Forest boundary and the East Entrance of Yellowstone National Park.

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1.Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2.Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
