SHOSHONE NATIONAL FOREST
SPECIAL ORDER

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area and roads described in this order and as shown in Exhibit A, within the Shoshone National Forest until further notice.

1. Using a motorized vehicle, including snowmobiles, on the following Forest Roads (FDR), [36 CFR 261.54(a)].

a.FDR 203.2c (Sunshine Creek) from its junction with FDR 219 to the point where it enters Section 21 of T47N., R102W.

b.FDR 219 (Timber Creek) from its junction with FDR 204 to the Forest Boundary (the portion of the road within Section 13, T47N., R103W).

c.FDR 222 (Dick Creek Lake) at the point adjacent to the lake to where the road dead ends.

2. Possessing or using a motorized vehicle, including snowmobiles, in the area off Forest Roads during the period between January 1 through April 30th annually, [36 CFR 261.56].

This prohibition applies to an area comprising all the lands draining into the North Fork of Dick Creek, Sunshine Creek, Pappapau Creek, and Sheep Creek downstream to the Forest Boundary.

3. Using a motorized vehicle, including snowmobiles, on the following Forest Roads during the period between January 1 through April 30th annually [36 CFR 261.54(a)]:

a.FDR 202 (Dick Creek) from its junction with the Sunshine Canal to the cattleguard on the Dick Creek and North Fork of Dick Creek divide.

b.FDR 203 (Sheep Point) from its junction with FDR 202 to the bottom of the first switchback.

c.FDR 219 (Timber Creek) from its junction at the Forest Boundary (located in T47N., R103W., Section 13) to its junction with FDR 203.2c.

d.FDR 222 (Dick Creek Lake) from its junction with FDR 202 to a point adjacent to Dick Creek Lake.

This restriction is established in order to prevent degradation to the soil and water resources and to prevent harrassment of wintering elk herds.

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Section 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
