

**San Bernardino National Forest Land Management Plan
Administrative Correction (36 CFR 219.7 (b))**

**Devers-Valley No. 1 Utility Corridor
September 8, 2006**

The following information is being administratively corrected in Part 2 San Bernardino National Forest Strategy of the 2005 San Bernardino National Forest Land Management Plan.

The following corrections should be noted in Part 2 San Bernardino National Forest Strategy:

1. Page 16. Devers-Valley No. 1 has been added to Table 487.

2. Map 2- San Bernardino National Forest South Land Use Zones (located behind page 161). A 1.81 mile segment of the Devers-Valley No. 1 Utility Corridor is located on the San Jacinto District of the San Bernardino National Forest. The Corridor crosses National Forest System lands described as the NE 1/4, Section 26, T.3 S., R.2 E., and N 1/2, Section 25, T.3 S., R.2 E., and N 1/2, Section 30, T.3 S., R.3 E., of the San Bernardino Meridian, in the County of Riverside, State of California.

The width of the corridor is 330 feet, being 100 feet right and 230 feet left of surveyed reference line thereof, having a total length of 9,561 feet (1.81 miles) across lands of the United States.

It is located in a Back Country Motorized Use Restricted land use zone surrounded on National Forest System lands by the existing San Jacinto Wilderness. It is also located

within the Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains National Monument and within the Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains National Monument “Place” (LMP Part 2).

3. Map 6- San Bernardino National Forest South scenic Integrity Objectives

The Scenic Integrity Objective is mapped as high within the 1.81 mile segment of the Devers-Valley No. 1 Utility Corridor located on the San Jacinto District of the San Bernardino National Forest in a Back Country Motorized Use Restricted land use zone surrounded on National Forest System lands by the existing San Jacinto Wilderness.
