



FOREST TRAVEL MAP




1. This change consists of adding the existing snowmobile trail as a motorcycle/mountain bike trail. This will provide an alternate route to the Garcia Park area and provide safer access to those who must now travel on the heavily used Garcia Park road.
2. The trails are now used by snowmobilers but were not shown on the previous Travel Guide.
3. This provides important access between Angel Fire and Valle Escondido for snowmobiles, motorcycles and ATV's.
4. This was an open road used by high clearance vehicles that was resulting in damage to the meadow at Osha Park and impacting wildlife security areas. It also provides access between Valle Escondido and Sipapu. The decision will close a portion of the road to vehicles over 40 inches.
5. Forest Road 440 has washed out and is no longer accessible to vehicles and therefore has been removed from the system. A trail has been added to provide a route between Taos and Sipapu for vehicles 40 inches and narrower.


This road has been open to travel. It was omitted when the original Forest Travel Map was printed.


This change corrects an error in the original Forest Travel Map. The "roads" should have been shown as motorcycle trails. Also reflected is a recently constructed trail section around private land.


Trail 61 in Angostura Canyon has been deleted as a motorcycle trail to provide wildlife habitat protection. This decision was made as a result of an interdisciplinary analysis of the Angostura Diversity Unit. The additional motorcycle trails shown are not a change since they have always been open to motorcycles. They have been added on the map, even though they are outside the restriction area to let cyclists know where these opportunities are.

FOREST TRAVEL MAP




The deletions reflect conditions that have been present on the ground for the last two hunting seasons. They were made to provide additional big game wildlife habitat protection.

This change adds the Maestas Ridge area to the existing Area 1, which will be closed to all forms of entry from December 26 to March 31 for wildlife habitat protection. This decision was made after three years of monitoring and numerous discussions with snowmobilers, cross-country skiers, and the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish.

The change on the Greenie Peak loop is made to improve map accuracy. The road deletion in section 9 is made so that vehicles are not encouraged in Bitter Creek Canyon where the road is badly washed out and unsafe.
