



ORDER NO. 80-1
WILDERNESS AND PRIMITIVE AREAS
PACIFIC SOUTHWEST REGION

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), each of the following is prohibited in any National Forest Wilderness or Primitive Area under my jurisdiction:

(1) Entering or being in a National Forest Wilderness without possessing a valid Wilderness Permit. 36 CFR 261.57(a).

(2) Going into or being upon any Primitive Area without possessing a valid Wilderness Permit. 36 CFR 261.53(f).

(3) Using a trail, campsite, or other area in the Emigrant Basin Primitive Area, Agua Tibia, Emigrant, San Geronimo, or San Jacinto Wilderness by a group larger than 15 persons without possessing a permit authorizing such use, issued by the Forest Supervisor. 36 CFR 261.58(f).

(4) Using a trail, campsite, or other area in any other wilderness or primitive area by a group larger than 25 persons without possessing a permit authorizing such use, issued by the Forest Supervisor or Administrator, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit. 36 CFR 261.58(f).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following persons is exempt from this order:

Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR, Part 261.

This supersedes Order No. 77-1, dated January 3, 1978.
