



Upper Hell Hole Campground

Location

22 miles east of Georgetown on Wentworth Springs Road, and 29 miles northeast on Forest Highway 2 (Eleven Pines road) to Hell Hole Reservoir, then 3 miles southeast by boat or hiking trail.

- ⇒ Hiking


Things You Should Know

- ◆ **CAUTION:** There are bears in the area. Please keep all foods, soaps, and garbage properly stored.
- ◆ The campground is only accessible by trail or boat.
- ◆ There is no piped water available at the campground. Lake water is available close by but should be boiled or filtered before using. Water quality testing is not performed on open water sources (mercury contamination).
- ◆ Use the fire ring provided and make sure your fire is dead out before leaving. Use only water, not soil. Use only dead and down wood.
- ◆ Check ahead. Campfires may not be allowed during fire restrictions.
- ◆ Watch for rattlesnakes.
- ◆ Do not feed the animals.
- ◆ Pack it in, pack it out.


Location Map
