


Map #2 Existing Direction for Motorized Use

Santa Fe National Forest - Eastside

This map shows the Santa Fe National Forest's current management direction for motorized travel.

The term "route" encompasses both roads and motorized trails. Open roads are in the Infrastructure (INFRA) database and meet the following criteria:
Jurisdiction = FS (Forest Service)
Route Status = Existing
System = NFSR (National Forest System Road)
Operative Maintenance Level = Open (2,3,4,5)
These roads reflect the INFRA database as of 09-11-07. For the Coyote Ranger District, Open Roads = Open, Proposed Closed, or proposed Decommissioned as specified in the District's Roads Analysis Process. Motorized Trails are trails with a designed use in the INFRA database for motorcycles &/or ATVs.

Existing direction regarding motorized cross-country travel is based on the Forest Plan, including the Forest Plan amendments to Management Areas F (Wild & Scenic Rivers), J (Gallinas Watershed), and X (Jemez National Recreation Area). The restrictions from the Off Road Vehicle Management Plan map "ORV Map," 1987) are incorporated. The Forest Plan prohibits motorized cross-country travel through National Registry of Historic Places (NRHP) sites. Areas having slopes greater than 40% were categorized as permitting travel on open roads only unless otherwise designated as non-motorized. Open roads within the Restricted areas on the ORV map and the open roads listed in the Coyote Ranger District's RAP were buffered 300 feet on either side of the road. Motorized cross-country travel is allowed within these corridors, but areas outside of them are not open to cross-country travel. The Forest's closure orders related to motorized travel have also been incorporated.

Mgmt Area	Emphasis
	TIMBER/WILDLIFE - Emphasis is on timber management and enhancement of wildlife habitat diversity consistent with other resource needs.
A	WILDLIFE/TIMBER - Emphasis is on wildlife habitat improvement and key habitat protection. Grazing and timber management activities occur where compatible with the primary emphasis.
B	RECREATION-VISUAL-WILDLIFE/TIMBER - Emphasis is on enhancement of visual quality and developed recreation while protecting essential wildlife habitat. Grazing and timber management occur where compatible with the primary emphasis.
C	RECREATION-VISUAL/TIMBER - Emphasis is on visual quality and developed recreation. Grazing and timber management occur where compatible with the primary emphasis.
D	DISPERSED RECREATION-VISUAL/TIMBER - Emphasis is on dispersed recreation, visual enhancement, timber and firewood production.
E	WILD & SCENIC RIVERS - Pecos, Chama, East Fork Jemez.
F	WILDLIFE-RANGE-FIREWOOD - Emphasis is on key wildlife habitat, forage production and firewood production with dispersed recreation.
G	WILDERNESS - Emphasis is on preservation and enhancement of wilderness values.
H	CULTURAL RESOURCES - Emphasis is on active management including protection, stabilization, interpretation, evaluation, and opportunities for research. (NOT DISPLAYED ON MAP)
I	GALLINAS CREEK WATERSHED - Emphasis is on water quality maintenance or enhancement and sustained water yield.
J	SENSITIVE SOILS AND SPECIES - Primary emphasis is on protection of sensitive species, ecosystems and fragile soils.
K	SEMI-PRIMITIVE NON-MOTORIZED RECREATION - Emphasis is on providing semi-primitive non-motorized recreation with other uses where compatible, although no roading will occur.
L	RESEARCH NATURAL AREAS - Managed to provide opportunities for non-disruptive research.
M	THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES HABITAT - Managed to protect and enhance essential wildlife habitat.
N	SANTA FE WATERSHED - Management emphasis is on quality water production. This area will continue to be managed according to the original closure order.
O	CULTURAL RESOURCES-TIMBER/WILDLIFE - Emphasis is on cultural resource location, inventory and nomination with timber management and wildlife habitat enhancement.
P	CULTURAL RESOURCES-DISPERSED RECREATION-VISUAL/TIMBER - Emphasis is on cultural resource location, inventory and nomination with dispersed recreation opportunities, visual enhancement and timber management.
Q	CULTURAL RESOURCES-WILDLIFE/TIMBER - Emphasis is on cultural resource location, inventory and nomination with wildlife habitat improvement timber management activities.
R	CULTURAL RESOURCES-TIMBER/WILDLIFE - Emphasis is on cultural resource location, inventory and nomination with key wildlife habitat protection, forage production and firewood production.
