FOREST ORDER NO. 05-04-52-22-14 USDA FOREST SERVICE INYO NATIONAL FOREST INYO CRATERS CLOSURE I

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Inyo National Forest. This Order is effective from August 1, 2022, through August 19, 2022.

- 1. Being on the following National Forest System roads, as shown on Exhibit A:
 - a. Road 3S30 north of its intersection with Road 3S22;
 - b. Road 3S30F;
 - c. Road 3S30G south of its intersection with Road 3S30L; and
 - d. Road 3S30L.

36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e).

- 2. Being on the following National Forest System trails, as shown on Exhibit A:
 - a. Trail 2705; and
 - b. Trail 2705A.

36 C.F.R. § 261.55(a).

3. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Inyo Craters Closure Area I, defined as: all lands within 100 feet of the National Forest System roads and trails listed in Prohibitions 1 and 2 above and shown on Exhibit A, including associated facilities (vault toilets) and parking areas. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:


- 1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions contained in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A. A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.

FOREST ORDER NO. 05-04-52-22-15 USDA FOREST SERVICE INYO NATIONAL FOREST INYO CRATERS CLOSURE II

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Inyo National Forest. This Order is effective from August 10, 2022, through September 2, 2022.

- 1. Being on the following National Forest System roads, as shown on Exhibit A:
 - a. Road 3S30 northwest of its intersection with Mammoth Scenic Loop; and
 - b. Road 3S22 from its intersection with Road 3S30 to its intersection with Road 3S30L.

36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e).

2. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Inyo Craters Closure Area II, defined as: all lands within 100 feet of the National Forest System roads listed in Prohibition 1 above and shown on Exhibit A. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e).

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- 1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
- 2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions contained in 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart A. A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
