



ORDER NO. 06-01-22-04

TEMPORARY PUBLIC USE RESTRICTIONS DESCHUTES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551, 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), the following prohibitions apply to all lands within the Deschutes National Forest. This Order becomes effective on September 9, 2022, and will remain in effect through November 30, 2022, unless rescinded sooner.

This order supersedes and rescinds order #06-01-22-01 signed by Forest Supervisor Holly Jewkes on July 6, 2022.

CLOSURE AREA DESCRIPTION:

These prohibitions apply to all lands within the Deschutes National Forest.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, including a charcoal fire. **36 CFR § 261.52(a)**
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a designated campground, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. **36 CFR § 261.52(d)**
3. Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device. **36 CFR § 261.52(f)**
4. Operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine in violation of Industrial Fire Precaution Level directives. **36 CFR § 261.52(h)**
5. Welding, or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame. **36 CFR § 261.52(i)**
6. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order meeting either:
 - U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a; or
 - Appropriate Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE recommended practice J335(b) and J350(a). **36 CFR § 261.52(j)**
7. Violating any state law concerning burning, fires, or which is for the purpose of preventing or restricting the spread of fire. **36 CFR § 261.52(k)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following are exempt from this Order:

- (1) Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
- (2) Any Federal, State, or Local Officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- (3) Petroleum-fueled stoves, lanterns or heating devices, provided such devices meet the fire underwriter's specifications for safety.
- (4) Campfires contained inside established fire rings within sites listed on Exhibit A.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of this prohibition are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC § 551; 18 USC § 3551, 3559, 3571, and 3581)
