ORDER NO. 06-01-01-23-03

**EMERGENCY FIRE CLOSURE**

Pursuant to 16 USC § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on National Forest System lands, roads and trails within the following described area on the Deschutes National Forest, and depicted in the attached Exhibit A. This Order becomes effective on November 22, 2022, and will remain in effect through April 30, 2023, or until rescinded.

This Order supersedes Order #06-01-01-23-01 signed by Forest Supervisor Holly Jewkes on October 8, 2022.

**PROHIBITIONS:**

1. Going into or being within an area closed for public health and safety. [36 CFR § 261.53 (e)]
2. Being on the road. [36 CFR § 261.54 (e)]
3. Being on a trail. [36 CFR § 261.55(a)]

**Affected Area/Closure Area** is described as the area starting at the Lane CO/Deschutes CO/Klamath CO junction in T22S-R6E Sec 14. The fire closure boundary goes north following the Lane CO/Deschutes CO boundary to FSR 4636 in T21S-R6E Sec 26. The boundary follows this road east to FSR 4630. The boundary follows FSR 4630 northeast to FSR 4635. The boundary follows FSR 4635 southeast to FSR 46 (Cascade Lakes Highway). The boundary follows FSR 46 south to FSR 4290 junction in T21S-R7E Sec 25. The boundary follows FSR 4290 east to the county line where it terminates with the boundary at the Lane CO/Deschutes CO/Klamath CO junction in T22S-R6E Sec 14.

This order closes all roads and trails within the closure boundary described above, the following perimeter roads remain open:

1. FSR 4635 remains open in entirety
2. FSR 4630 remains open from FSR 4635 to its junction with 4636 and 640
3. FSR 46 remains open between its junction with FSR 4635 and 4920

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this order.

2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of this prohibition are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC § 551; 18 USC § 3551, 3559, 3571, and 3581)
