***TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES***

**PROHIBITIONS**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(b), the following is prohibited on the National Forest System (NFS) roads in the Douglas Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, described below and shown on the attached map incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A ("the Described Roads"):

1. Using any type of motorized vehicle. **36 C.F.R. § 261.54(a).**

**EXEMPTIONS**

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with Forest Service Permit FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order or a written determination by a Forest Service authorized officer that a permit is not required under 36 C.F.R. § 251.50(e)(1) or (2).
2. Any Federal, State, or Local Law Enforcement Officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

**DESCRIBED ROADS**

The Described Roads, NFS Road 42B and NFS Road 4301, are within Township 17 South, Range 30 East, Sections 25, 35 and 36, and within Township 17 South, Range 31 East, Section 30, respectively. NFS Road 42B is closed starting at the National Forest boundary south of Paradise, Arizona, following southwest to its terminus at NFS Road 42. NFS Road 4301 is closed starting at its intersection with NFS Road 42B, following southeast to its terminus.

**PURPOSE**

To protect public health and safety from hazardous conditions associated with the degradation of NFS Roads 42B and 4301, pending repair.

## IMPLEMENTATION

1. This Order shall be in effect from February 14, 2023 at 8:00 p.m. through March 31, 2023 at 11:59 p.m., unless rescinded.
2. A map identifying the Described Roads are attached and made part of this Order as Exhibits A. For a digital version of this Order and Exhibit A, go to <https://www.fs.usda.gov/alerts/coronado/alerts-notices>.
3. Unless otherwise expressly defined in this Order, the terms used in this Order are defined by the regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture, 36 C.F.R. Chapter II, Parts 200-299. If there are terms in this Order that are not expressly defined in the Order or 36 C.F.R. Chapter II, Parts 200-299, their meaning shall be determined by their plain language definitions.
4. A violation of the above prohibition is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for organizations, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551; 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
