

RULES FOR CAMPING AND TRAVELING ON THE MANTI-LA SAL NATIONAL FOREST

CAMPING RULES -

- Vehicles may be no more than 150 feet off the road for picnicking and camping unless otherwise posted.
- Camping stay limit is 14 days. You must move your camp at least 10 miles after 14 days.
- Camping equipment may not be left unattended for longer than 72 hours.
- "Pack it In, Pack it Out" is forest policy. Dumpsters are not available for public use.
- Campers in developed sites must use the toilet facilities, trailer holding tanks or porta potties. Dump stations are located in communities surrounding the Forest.
- Campers must abide by current fire restrictions.

LIVESTOCK -

- Weed-free hay or pellets are required for livestock.

SHOOTING -

- Shooting is not allowed within 150 yards of campsites, roads or lakes.

TRAVEL RULES -

- Travel ONLY on designated roads and trails.**
- Do not travel cross-country.
- No one under eight years of age is allowed to operate any OHV on public lands, roads or trails in Utah.
- Utah state law requires all off-highway vehicle operators to complete a Utah Off-Highway Vehicle Education Course. Non-residents must also buy a permit to drive on public lands. For more information: <https://recreation.utah.gov/off-highway-vehicles/ohv-education-course/>
- A properly fastened helmet having a DOT approved safety rating is required for all OHV operators and passengers under the age of 18.
- All OHVs must be registered.
- It is illegal for anyone to operate an OHV in a way that damages the environment, including air, land, water, watershed, plant, or animal life.
- Only carry passengers if your OHV is specifically designed to do so.
- All riders younger than 18, riding on a public highway not limited to OHV use, must be under the direct supervision of someone 18 years of age or older. Supervisor must be within 300 feet, have visual contact and be able to advise or assist the rider.
