Occupancy and Use Prohibitions

PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a), the following apply to the National Forest System (NFS) lands within the Pikes Peak Ranger District, Pike-San Isabel National Forests & Cimarron and Comanche National Grasslands, described below and shown on the attached map incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A (the “Described Area”):

1. Camping, except in designated campsites within the developed Craggs Campground. 36 C.F.R. § 261.58(e).
2. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a campfire, or stove fire, except at designated campsites within the developed Craggs Campground. 36 C.F.R. § 261.52(a)
3. Parking or leaving a vehicle, except in a designated Trailhead parking area, or in campsite parking areas within the developed Craggs Campground. 36 C.F.R. § 261.58(g).

EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order, specifically exempting them from this Order or a written determination by a Forest Service authorized officer that a permit is not required under 36 C.F.R. § 251.50(e)(1) or (2).
2. Any Federal, State, or Local Officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting resource in the performance of an official duty.

DESCRIBED AREA

The Described Area is located in Teller County, Colorado, and includes all NFS lands within ¼ mile of: (1) NFS Road 383 beginning just east of Colorado Highway 67 at the junction of the NFS boundary and NFS Road 383 and ending at the end of NFS Road 383; and (2) NFS Road 383.A, also known as the Craggs Campground Road.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Order is to protect natural resources and public health and safety.

IMPLEMENTATION

1. This Order shall be in effect from March 14, 2023, at 12:01 a.m. through March 13, 2024, at 11:59 p.m., unless rescinded.
2. A map identifying the Described Area is attached and made part of this Order as Exhibit A. For a digital version of this Order and Exhibit A, go to <https://www.fs.usda.gov/alerts/psicc/alerts-notices>.
3. Unless otherwise expressly defined in this Order, the terms used in this Order are defined by the regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture, 36 C.F.R. Chapter II, Parts 200-299. If there are terms in this Order that are not expressly defined in the Order or 36 C.F.R. Chapter II, Parts 200-299, their meaning shall be determined by their plain language definitions.
4. A violation of the above prohibitions is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for organizations, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551; 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581.
