

ORDER NO. 10-15-11
TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE
SIX RIVERS NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(b), and to provide for public safety, the following act is prohibited within the Six Rivers National Forest. This Order is effective from October 15, 2015, until the Rivers Complex Fire is fully suppressed.

Being on the National Forest System roads listed below and shown on the attached map.

- a. Forest Road No. 7N53, from its intersection with the East Fork of Horse Linto Creek, then north to its intersection with Grizzly Camp Trailhead.
- b. Forest Road No. 7N10, from its intersection with Onion Camp, then northwest to its intersection with Forest Road No. 7N04.
- c. Forest Road No. 6N24, from its intersection with Forest Road No. 7N53, then southwest to its intersection with Forest Road No. 6N10.
- d. Forest Road No. 6N10, from its intersection with the Lower Trinity Ranger District boundary, then southwest to its intersection with 6N32.

36 CFR 261.54(e).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.

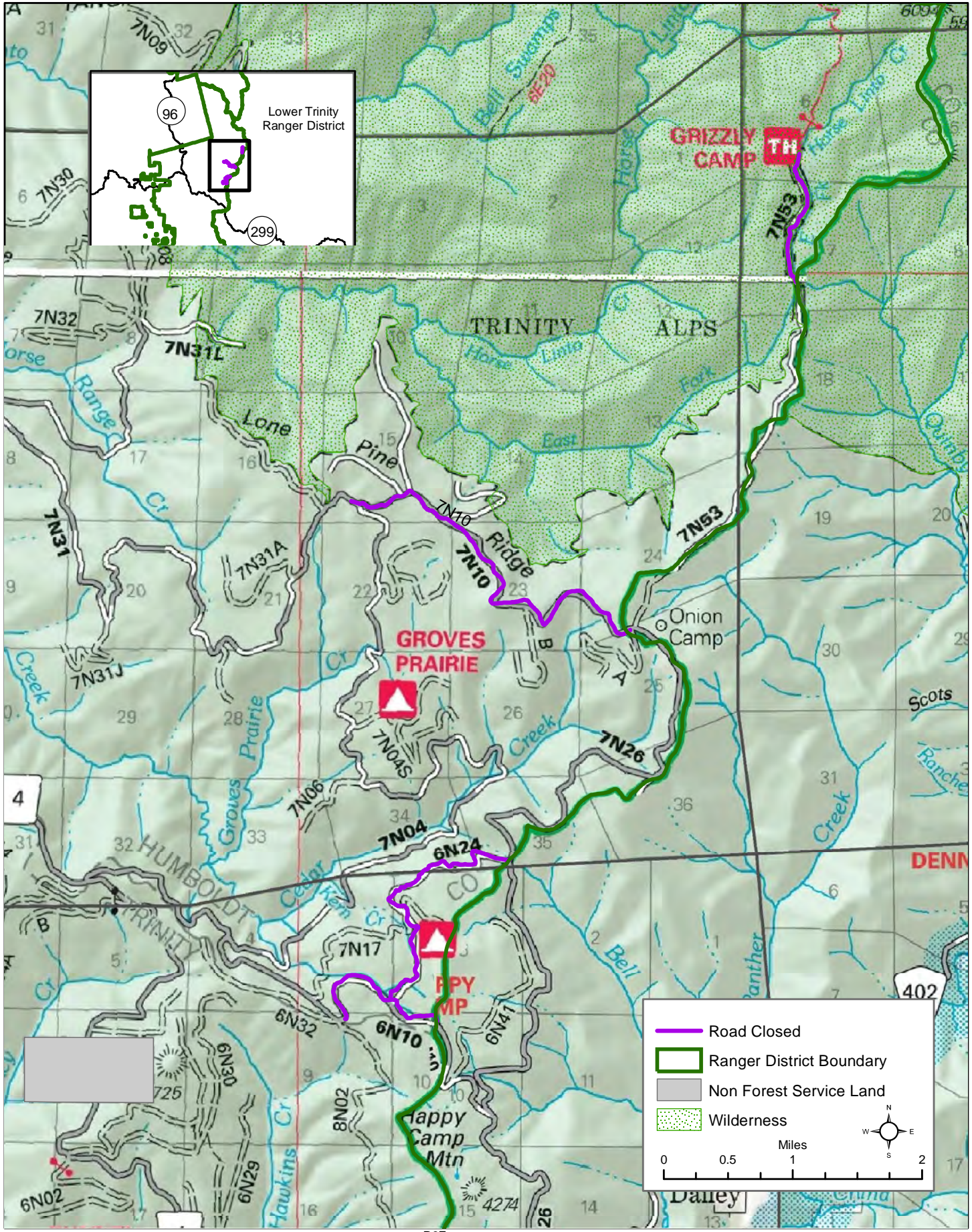
