

The Plumas National Forest is soliciting competitive offers for the Oak Ridge Stewardship Project. The Oak Ridge Stewardship Project is located within T. 23N, R 6E, Sections 2,3,12,13 and T. 23N, R 7E, Sections 10,14,15., M.D.B.&M. Sealed – “Best Value” offers will be received at the Plumas National Forest Supervisor's Office at 159 Lawrence Street, Quincy, CA 95971 local time on December 3, 2015 at 10:00 AM, for an estimated 5,634 Tons (784 MBF) of sawtimber marked or otherwise designated for cutting on 137 acres in 9 subdivisions. The only mandatory stewardship work item is to cut and skid all biomass to the landing. Chipping and removal of biomass is subject to agreement.

The Forest Service will evaluate competitive offers submitted by offerors who present a price offer and technical proposal according to the information found under the section in the offer titled “Instructions to Offerors.” Evaluation factors for this project are organizational experience, organizational past performance, local community economic enhancement (including small business enhancement), understanding the Government’s requirements, and price. One award will be made to the offeror whose proposal is technically acceptable and whose technical/price relationship is the “best value” to the Government. The Forest Service reserves the right to reject any and all offers. A prospectus is available to the public and interested offerors from the offices listed below.
